ENGINEER REPORT

ACTION ITEMS:

1. NJDOT Local Aid FY 2020 – 14th Street Roadway Improvements, Phase III (ARH #11-40058):

The construction contract is complete. We have provided a recommendation to approve the final

quantities change order, accept the maintenance bond, and approve final payment. Once this is accepted and approved by Council, we can begin the NJDOT closeout procedures.

Action Requested:

- 1. Approve Final Quantities Change Order for 14th Street Roadway Improvements.
- 2. Approve the Final Payment for 14th Street Roadway Improvements.
- 3. Accept the Maintenance Bond for 14th Street Roadway Improvements.

2. Hammonton Bike Path Connector (ARH #11-40052):

The construction contract is complete. We have provided a recommendation to approve the final quantities change order, accept the maintenance bond, and approve final payment. Once this is accepted and approved by Council, we can begin the NJDOT closeout procedures.

3. Skinner Property / 317 N. Egg Harbor Road (ARH #11-01074.01):

The HDSRF grant application has been reviewed by NJDEP. The Town has received notice that this project will be funded. ARH has provided a proposal for the work outlined in the grant.

1. Approve ARH Proposal for Skinner Property Remedial Investigation.

Roadway & Transportation Projects

4. Valley Avenue – Broadway to Central (ARH #11-30159):

Plans were sent to NJDOT, we have received a few comments that have been addressed. As discussed previously, we will look to set a bid date for later this year. The goal is to advertise this project and School House at the same time in an attempt to get an economy of scale. Spring 2022 is the current anticipated construction start.

5. School House Lane – 3rd Street to Rt. 54 (ARH #11-40060): No Status Change

As discussed previously, this project is currently getting scheduled to be re-bid later this year. In an effort to obtain an economy of scale, this project will be bid with Valley Avenue. The intent is to bid later this year, with a work start anticipated in the Spring of 2022.

6. NJDOT – Local Aid Grants (ARH #11-40041): No status change.

The NJDOT accepted applications for FY2022 funding. As authorized ARH prepared the following applications for funding consideration:

Municipal Aid

Old Forks Road from the WHP to Town Line
Bikeways

Termination of current path to the Lake Park
Safe Streets to Transit

Flashing Beacons on 11th street at the Bike Path
crossing and improvements to the Train Station

Applications have been submitted and are pending NJDOT review.

Environmental Projects

7. K&K Linens Property / 224 Vine Street (ARH #11-01094.01):

As authorized ARH has prepared specifications for obtaining a contractor via quotes. The Town has been coordinating with various contractors to obtain the quotes for the work. If pricing comes in under the quote threshold our office will work with the contractor to have the building demolished. If the pricing is over the quote threshold, we will work with the Town to publicly bid this work. Separately we are preparing estimates to seek funding for the demolition activities. ARH is also working on revising the HDSRF grant.

8. Mazza Muffler Site / 104 S. Egg Harbor Road (ARH #11-01102):

ARH is working on completing the Preliminary Assessment. Once completed, we can proceed forward with demolition specifications and obtaining a contractor. Additionally, once the report is completed the HDSRF grant will be revised.

9. Octagon Oil/Vine Street Parking Lot (ARH #11-01060):

ARH is currently preparing a Remedial Action Permit (RAP) application for ground water (GW) impacts. Due to 90% of all RAP GW applications to submissions to the state being deficient, ARH is seeking a technical consult from the NJDEP before submission. If deemed necessary, ARH will provide a proposal for the required work to address any technical deficiencies.

Celona Site Remediation - 130 Railroad Avenue (ARH #11-01054):

As previously reported; three (3) permanent wells were installed and tested. ARH conducted a round of groundwater testing on 9/21/21 and installed a temporary deep well for the purpose of vertical delineation. Two rounds of groundwater testing are left in the grant; testing occurs each quarter.

SEWER/WATER INFORMATION ITEMS:

11. 2021/2022 Water Capital Projects (ARH #21-0078):

We have completed the field work and base plan preparation for all roadways. Our primary focus is to address Rt 54 to stay ahead of the NJDOT roadway project. Related to Rt. 54 we have finalized the plans and technical specification, we are in the process of finalizing the NJDEP applications. For reference the projects authorized include:

Rt 54 - First Road to Second Road

S. First Road - Tenth Street to dead end (in the vicinity of Birch

Drive)

WHP & Seagrove - A portion of main at the WHP & extension along

Seagrove

Design work for S. First Road and WHP & Seagrove has started.

12. Boyer Avenue Pump Station (ARH #11-50144):

At the last meeting bids were rejected for this project due to cost. We are regrouping with the PWTC to see if we can adjust the approach to the project.

GENERAL SITE AND RECREATION INFORMATION ITEMS:

13. Lake Park ADA Playground/Small Cities (ARH #11-01100):

Since the last reporting period, meetings occurred between our office, the Town, The Town's Landscape Architect, and various stakeholders to gain input on the project. The design is currently on hold pending additional information from the Town's Landscape Architect related to the visioning effort at this site.
