Introduction of Ordinance #017-2021- Amending Chapter 271 Speed Table Boyer Ave

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 271 OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Hammonton, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. Chapter 271, Article IV, Section 28, the chart is amended to add the following:

2. Chapter 271, Article IV, a new Section 271-31 is added which states as follows:

§271-31. Speed Hump and Traffic Calming Measures

A. <u>Definitions</u>. For the purpose of this Section 271-31, the following terms shall have the <u>meanings indicated:</u>

SPEED HUMP – means one of several traffic calming measures which uses force of vertical acceleration to discourage speeding (i.e. all vertical speed deflectors, including but not limited to, speed tables, raised crosswalks, raised intersections, and modified speed humps).

TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURE – means the combination of physical controls and community support to reduce the negative effects of motor vehicle use, alter driver behavior, and improve conditions for non-motorized users, and includes, but is not limited to, speed humps.

VERTICAL SPEED DEFLECTOR – means a raised area in the roadway pavement surface extending

- B. Hammonton may, without the approval of the Commissioner of the New Jersey

 Department of Transportation, construct a speed hump on two-lane residential streets and on one-way residential streets under municipal jurisdiction with a posted speed limit of 30 mph or less and which have fewer than 3,000 vehicles per day. Notwithstanding, this Section 271-31(B), prior to a municipality constructing a speed hump which: 1) places any impact on roadways in an adjoining municipality, Town Council shall provide appropriate notice to the adjoining municipality; or 2) places any impact on a State roadway shall obtain the approval of the Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Transportation.
- C. Any speed hump constructed shall conform in design and construction to the technical standards established by the New Jersey Department of Transportation. The Town shall provide advance warning, in the form of the erection of appropriate signs giving notice of

the presence of speed humps before the first speed hump in a series of speed humps and provide for a pavement marker to be placed at the location of the first speed hump. The signing and pavement markings for a speed hump shall conform to the current standards prescribed in the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways as adopted by the New Jersey Commissioner of Transportation.

The surveyors for the consultant have started the work on the project area, establishing survey control and gathering field information to purpose a base plan for the project area.

Cedar Branch/Cedar Brook Stream Corridor Debris Cleaning

Requests for right-of-entry to complete light cleaning along the stream corridor were sent out to residents that reside along the stream corridor extending from Fourth Street to the White Horse Pike.
