Scott Taylor from Taylor Design Group gave a presentation on the Lake Park upgrades that the Town is planning. He gave an overview of the following:

- Using one brand throughout Town at all parks and public locations. (benches and colors)
- Make Lake Park a better use of the space
- Reviewed plans in detail and gave detailed info on the entire project.
- Spoke about updating walking trails, parking, playground equipment and docks that overlook the lake.
