Public Hearing of Ordinance #008-2026 – Establish a CAP bank for the 2026 Budget

TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Hammonton in the County of Atlantic finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2026 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Town Council hereby determines that a 1.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$200,059.80 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Town Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Council of the Town of Hammonton, in the County of Atlantic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2026 budget year, the final appropriations of the Town of Hammonton shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$466,806.20, and that the CY 2026 municipal budget for the Town of Hammonton be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Public Hearing of bond ordinance #006-2026- Airport Improvements

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AIRPORT DEVELOPMENT AND/OR NOISE PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION AT THE HAMMONTON MUNICIPAL AIRPORT, BY AND IN THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING \$293,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$14,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWN TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) **AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION 1. The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement or purpose to be undertaken by the Town of Hammonton, in the County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey (the "Town"). For the said improvement or purpose stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$293,000, which sum includes a \$278,053 Airport Improvement Program grant expected to be received from the United States Department of Transportation Federal Aviation Administration (the "FAA Grant"), and \$947.00 as the amount of down payment for said improvement or purpose required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"). Said down payment is now available therefor by virtue of an appropriation in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Town for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof and to meet the part of said \$293,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment and the FAA Grant, negotiable bonds of the Town are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$14,000 pursuant to, and within the limitations prescribed by, the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Town in a principal amount not exceeding \$14,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to, and within the limitations prescribed by, the Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and purpose for the financing of which said bonds or notes are to be issued is for airport development and/or noise program implementation at the Hammonton Municipal Airport. The improvements and purposes set forth in Section 3(a) shall also include, as applicable, all engineering and design work related thereto, surveying, construction planning, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid

documents, construction inspection and contract administration, environmental testing and remediation and all work, materials, equipment, labor and appurtenances necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said improvement or purpose is \$14,000.

(a) The estimated cost of said improvement or purpose is \$293,000, the excess thereof over the said estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, is the down payment in the amount of \$947.00 for said improvement or purpose and the FAA Grant.

Public Hearing of Bond Ordinance #007-2026 – Route 54 Water Main Project

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR WATER MAIN AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS, BY AND IN THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING \$2,600,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,600,000 BONDS OR NOTES TO FINANCE THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), **AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION 1. The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Water/Sewer Utility (the "Utility") of the Town of Hammonton, in the County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey (the "Town") as general improvements. For the said improvements stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the amount of \$2,600,000. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c)

of the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq., as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"), no down payment is required as this bond ordinance involves environmental infrastructure projects, which are funded by loans from the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (the "I-Bank") and the State of New Jersey, acting by and through the Department of Environmental Protection ("NJDEP"). Additionally, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-7(h) and 40A:2-11(c) of the Local Bond Law, no down payment is required as the Utility of the Town is self-liquidating.

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof and to fund the \$2,600,000 appropriation, negotiable bonds of the Town are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$2,600,000 pursuant to, and within all limitations prescribed by, the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Town in a principal amount not exceeding \$2,600,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to, and within the limitations prescribed by, said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. The improvements hereby authorized and purposes for the financing of which said debt obligations to be issued are for the water main and drainage improvements along the entire lengths or portions thereof Route 54 and 12th Street in and for the Water/Sewer Utility of the Town.

a. All improvements shall include, as applicable, all field work, materials, equipment, engineering and site investigation, design, regulatory approvals, architectural work, environmental consulting work, demolition, and excavation, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid documents, surveying, conducting and preparation of reports and studies, environmental testing and remediation, equipment rental, labor and appurtenances necessary therefore or incidental thereto.

b. The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said improvements or purposes is \$2,600,000.

c. The estimated cost of said improvements or purposes is \$2,600,000.

Public Hearing of Ordinance #10-2026- Amend Chapter 175 section 53 Land Development Ordinance

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 175 OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Hammonton, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. Section 175-53 of the Town of Hammonton Land Development Ordinance is amended to read as follows:

- A. The Chairman of the Planning Board shall appoint a Development Review Committee. The Committee shall consist of the following:
 - 1. At least one (1), but no more than four (4), regular or alternate Planning Board Members;
 - 2. The Board Engineer;
 - 3. The Board Planner;
 - 4. The Board Solicitor; and
 - 5. The Traffic Consultant on an as needed basis.
- B. The Planning Board Chairman shall designate a Committee Chair from among the members of the Committee.
- C. An Applicant may request an informal review of a concept design plan for which an Applicant intends to prepare and submit an application for development.
- D. A concept design plan and the supporting documents for a proposed development shall show a general informal design of the development, including proposed building types if located in a Downtown District or Gateway District, and its public improvements.
- E. The Development Review Committee shall review the conceptual plan presented by the Applicant to provide insight as to the deficiencies of said plan, and to comment on the acceptability of the proposed plan.
- F. The Development Review Committee meeting is a working session between the Committee and the Applicant. The meeting is used to provide the Applicant with a review of his/her/its application. Positive review of the concept design plan by the Committee does not constitute an approval of the concept or plan, nor shall it be considered a valid basis for the construction of improvements or for other commitments which depend upon its design characteristics. Comments made by the Committee are non-binding. As such, neither the Applicant nor the Board shall be bound by the actions, suggestions or recommendations of the Committee.
- G. An Applicant upon making a request for an informal review before the Committee must submit to the Planning Board Secretary at least ten (10) days before a scheduled committee meeting six (6) copies of the concept design plan.

- H. The Committee shall meet on a monthly basis at a date, time and location within Town Hall selected by the Chairman of the Planning Board at the reorganization meeting of the Planning Board for the whole year.
- I. An Applicant desiring to appear before the Development Review Committee must pay an application fee of \$50.00 and an escrow fee of \$1,000.00.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that if any section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by the Courts to be invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provision so adjudicated, and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any Ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict; and

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, DETERMINING THE FORM AND OTHER DETAILS OF ITS "NOTE RELATING TO THE WATER BANK CONSTRUCTION FINANCING PROGRAM OF THE NEW JERSEY INFRASTRUCTURE BANK", TO BE ISSUED IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF UP TO \$2,600,000, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF SUCH NOTE TO THE NEW JERSEY INFRASTRUCTURE BANK, AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF SUCH NOTE BY THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON IN FAVOR OF THE NEW JERSEY INFRASTRUCTURE BANK, ALL PURSUANT TO THE WATER BANK CONSTRUCTION FINANCING PROGRAM OF THE NEW JERSEY INFRASTRUCTURE BANK

WHEREAS, the Town of Hammonton (the "Local Unit" or "Town"), in the County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need within the Local Unit to acquire, construct, renovate or install a project consisting of water main and drainage improvements along the entire lengths or portions thereof Route 54 and 12th Street in and for the Water/Sewer Utility of the Town (the "Project"), and it is the desire of the Local Unit to obtain financing for such Project through participation in the environmental infrastructure financing program (the "New Jersey Water Bank") of the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (the "I-Bank");

WHEREAS, the Local Unit has determined to temporarily finance the acquisition, construction, renovation or installation of the Project prior to the long term bond closing with respect to the New Jersey Water Bank, and to undertake such temporary financing with the proceeds of a short-term loan to be made by the I-Bank (the "Construction Loan") to the Local Unit, pursuant to the Water Bank Construction Financing Program of the I-Bank (the "Construction Financing Program");

WHEREAS, in order to (i) evidence and secure the repayment obligation of the Local Unit to the I-Bank with respect to the Construction Loan, and (ii) satisfy the requirements of the Construction Financing Program, it is the desire of the Local Unit to issue and sell to the I-Bank the "Note Relating: to the Water Bank Construction Financing Program of the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank" in an aggregate principal amount of up to \$2,600,000 (the "Note");

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Local Unit to authorize, execute, attest and deliver the Note to the I-Bank pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey, constituting Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey (the "Local Bond Law"), and other applicable law; and

WHEREAS, Section 28 of the Local Bond Law allows for the sale of the Note to the I-Bank, without any public offering, and N.J.S.A. 58:11B-9 allows for the sale of the Note to the I-Bank without any public offering, all under the terms and conditions set forth therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Local Unit as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with Section 28 of the Local Bond Law and N.J.S.A. 58:11B-9, the Local Unit hereby authorizes the issuance, sale and award of the Note in accordance with the provisions hereof. The obligation represented by the Note has been appropriated and authorized by bond ordinance number 007-2026 of the Local Unit finally adopted by the Local Unit at a meeting duly called and held on May 26, 2026, which bond ordinance is entitled "BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR WATER MAIN AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS, BY AND IN THE TOWN OF HAMMONTON, IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING \$2,600,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,600,000 BONDS OR NOTES TO FINANCE THE COST THEREOF", at which time a quorum was present and acted throughout, all pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law and other applicable law.

Section 2. The Chief Financial Officer of the Local Unit (the "Chief Financial Officer") is hereby authorized to determine, in accordance with the Local Bond Law and pursuant to the terms and conditions hereof, (i) the final principal amount of the Note (subject to the maximum limitation set forth in Section 4(a) hereof), and (ii) the dated date of the Note.

Section 3. Any determination made by the Chief Financial Officer pursuant to the terms hereof shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution and attestation of the Note by the parties authorized pursuant to Section 4(h) hereof.

Section 4. The Local Unit hereby determines that certain terms of the Note shall be as follows:

- (a) the principal amount of the Note to be issued shall be an amount up to \$2,600,000;
- (b) the maturity of the Note shall be as determined by the I-Bank;
- (c) the interest rate of the Note shall be as determined by the I-Bank;
- (d) the purchase price for the Note shall be par;
- (e) the Note shall be subject to prepayment prior to its stated maturity in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Note;
- (f) the Note shall be issued in a single denomination and shall be numbered "NJWB-CFP-2026-01";
- (g) the Note shall be issued in fully registered form and shall be payable to the registered owner thereof as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America; and
- (h) the Note shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer (collectively, the "Authorized Officers") under official seal or facsimile thereof affixed, imprinted, or reproduced thereon and attested by the manual signature of the Local Unit Acting Municipal Clerk.
